



Introduction

Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE) is the world's largest provider of international qualifications for 14–19 year olds. CAIE is part of the University of Cambridge and is a not-for-profit organisation.

British Council Indonesia Foundation is one of the registered centres with CAIE providing examinations such as Cambridge IGCSE, AS and A-level examinations to candidates.

What are Cambridge International AS and A-levels examinations?

Cambridge International AS-levels have half the content of the corresponding Cambridge International A-level and may be completed in one year. AS-level is a qualification in its own right or as a stage on the way to Cambridge International A-level.

Cambridge International A-Levels typically take two years to complete and offer a flexible course of study that gives students the freedom to select the subjects that are right for them.

Cambridge International A-level is one of the most popular academic qualifications around the world for 16 to 19 year olds. Cambridge International AS & A-level qualifications are widely recognised and valued by universities and employers alike. Every year, thousands of Cambridge International A-level students gain places at good universities worldwide - including the UK, USA, Canada, New Zealand and Australia.

Where are Cambridge International AS and A-levels accepted and recognized?

Cambridge International A-level is a 'gold standard' qualification.

- Good Cambridge International AS and A-level grades are the key to admission to all the world's major English-speaking universities and many non-English speaking universities.
- Good grades at Cambridge International A-levels can result in up to one full year of advanced standing or credit at universities in the USA and Canada.
- Cambridge International AS-level carries half the weighting of an A-level and are typically awarded half the credit value.

This is a general guide. To find out the exact number of Cambridge International AS and A-levels and grades required for further study, it is advisable to contact the individual university or institute of higher education.

Who can take Cambridge International AS and A-level examinations?

There is no age restriction or basic qualification required to enter Cambridge International AS and A-level examinations. Cambridge International AS-level examinations are usually taken at age 17, and Cambridge International A-level examinations at age 18.

If you have already taken Cambridge IGCSEs or O-levels, then you will find many of the skills you have already learnt relevant to and beneficial for Cambridge International AS and A-level study.

What is Cambridge International AS & A-levels staged assessment?

Learners will find Cambridge International AS and A-levels very flexible. Learners can choose from a range of assessment options:

Assessment Options	
Option 1	Take all papers of the Cambridge International A-level course in the same examination session, usually at the end of the second year of study
Option 2	Take a 'staged' assessment route – take the Cambridge International AS-level in one examination session and complete the final Cambridge International A-level at a subsequent session*
Option 3	Take the Cambridge International AS-level only, either at the end of a one-year or two-year course. The Cambridge International AS-level syllabus content is half of Cambridge International A-level programme.

*The staged assessment route is not possible in all subjects. The outcomes awarded for Cambridge International AS-level language syllabuses cannot be carried forward to Cambridge International A-level.

When are the Cambridge International AS and A-level examinations?

Cambridge International AS and A-level examinations are held twice a year, in June and November with results issued in August and January respectively.

Candidates are to register with British Council Indonesia Foundation for examinations before the closing dates.

How can I register for Cambridge International AS and A-level exams?

Candidates can register with British Council Indonesia Foundation by submitting completed application forms before the registration closing dates. Applications forms are available from at our website www.britishcouncilfoundation.id.

You may submit the application form in person or by post. You have to pay the examination fee in full when you register.

Withdrawal from examination

No transfer or postponement of examinations from one session to another (e.g. November to June).

No refund will be given for any other reasons including clashes of dates with local examinations, personal and holiday arrangements. A refund of 70% will be considered on a case-by-case basis if supported by original certificate from a recognised medical practitioner.

Taking Examinations with British Council Indonesia Foundation

British Council Indonesia Foundation will email candidates the details of the examinations (date, time and venue), Statement of Entry from CAIE, Notice to Candidate and the whole package within 3 weeks before the examinations start. Candidates are to follow the schedule of the examinations issued by the British Council Indonesia Foundation.

Results and Certificates

Candidates may now have direct access to their results via **Candidate Results Website** at <https://myresults.cie.org.uk>. Each candidate will have their personal login details sent by email 3 weeks before the results are release. The statement of results lists all syllabuses entered by individual candidate and the grades awarded. They are not Certificates and may not necessarily be accepted by a University or other public body.

Certificates are issued to candidates in end October for June examinations and end March for November examinations by the stipulated deadline. Performances below Grade E are not recorded on Certificates. Certificates not collected may be destroyed / returned to exam board.
